A New Perspective On Life

e (the Kitchen family) have been living in Auckland and have been part of Mountainside for coming up 18 months. But it was only last year that I had a conversation with Pastor William Heidrich when he was visiting his family, which led me to walk up and take a look at Mount Wellington from the top. He said to me: "You should go up there sometime and have a look because it will give you a good perspective of Auckland".

Now I had been driving past Mount Wellington on a daily basis for some time, but it never occurred to me to go up and have a look around! I was always focusing on what was right in front of me. So one Sunday afternoon, we as a family went up to see the view. Indeed, William was right, you do get a very good perspective of the Auckland area.


Having a broader perspective means that you see things differently. You notice things that you didn't before. In some ways, we were able to see how certain parts of Auckland fit together. For the first time since I moved here, it gave me a sense of direction. I began to notice where things were in relation to their surroundings.

As we begin a new year ahead of us, I was thinking about the view from Mount Wellington when driving past it on the way to church on Sunday. I began thinking about how in the busyness of life (and all that happens throughout a year), we can so easily get bogged down in what is directly in front of us. Perhaps only looking at what we need to see in order to get to where we need to go. Which can be good, but perhaps at times this means that we have a limited perspective on life. As a Christian who believes in God, I believe that he has a bigger picture of life in view. He sees how everything fits together. He sees how all the different relationships work out. He sees the plan that he has for us as his people. You see, God has a complete perspective on our lives.

A part of the journey of following Christ Jesus in this life is lifting our eyes off our limited view of life and looking at Christ and how he sees the world. In other words, look at the world through Christ's perspective. Paying attention to what he sees. Looking at ourselves and others through his eyes. Paying attention to the bigger picture that he has for our life.

Allowing Christ Jesus to challenge us and to give us a different perspective is, in my opinion, a part of what it means to grow in our faith in him. He works in us to help us to see what he sees. ... continued page 2 ...


