Giving Thanks For The Encouragers Among Us

ver the last few months I have been doing some visiting with people in their homes. As I have been with people, where we have been talking about many different things, something I have noticed is that there are many positive encouraging people among us here at Mountainside. This is something that I have come to appreciate as a real gift.

I would like to share with you a reading from Romans 8: 4-8, where it says: "For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith; if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully."

I have spent some time pondering on the above scripture reading from Romans, which talks about different gifts that God gives us as the body of Christ, His church. One of the gifts that God gives people stands out to me and it comes from verse 8, which says: "if it is to encourage, then give encouragement..."

Who would have thought that something as simple as a word of encouragement is a gift given by the grace of God to his church! The more I thought about this the more I recognized the need for us to encourage one another, but also the need to receive encouragement from one another.

A conversation with someone, who speaks encouraging words has a way of breaking through barriers and building up and strengthening us on our walk of faith as Christians. And it stands out because too often, perhaps without even realising it, we can become discouraged; we can focus on the negatives that we see; looking at the things that are not happening that should be.

I am amazed at how many times I have had conversations with people, who don't deny the reality of the negative things that happen, but that in the midst of things they speak words of encouragement, where I walk away feeling lighter and positive in my walk with God. Has this ever happened to you? This is a gift of grace that God gives us.

We have people at Mountainside, whom God has placed among us who are great encouragers; who are great at building people up; who help people see what God is doing among us.

I encourage you all to give thanks for these people and receive from them all that God wants to give you through them. But also to put the challenge out there to pray that God will help us to have the gift of encouragement so that we can be encouraging of others and bless them with his grace.

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TINY TOTS 2019

Who knows the Teddy Bear's Picnic song: "If you go down to the woods today, you're in for a big surprise... for that's the way the teddy bears have their picnic"?

Actually, it's not quite 'every child that ever there was', but we do have a consistent little group of families attending with recently about 7 children each week. With consistent attendance, and consistent volunteers (plus casual volunteers), it feels like we are getting to know these precious families and can support them better.


We start off each session with around 20 mins of free play, where children discover new toys and learn valuable skills about playing together & sharing, and slowly gain confidence interacting with people other than Mum. Then we gather everyone on the mat to have a time of singing and music. We often sing many of the same songs, but it is a joy to see shy children learn the songs & the actions and begin to participate with enthusiasm. In the past 6 months we have also been more often including a brief story time, usually with a bible story or truth (told in simple toddler language of course). Many of the families attending do not have church connections, so sometimes this is all they hear about the Christian faith. Earlier this year after telling a simple version of the Easter story, one of the mothers thanked us saying "I've never heard that story before".

After our music time, we have morning tea together, during which Pastor Nich and Pastor William will often join us, and then a time of craft. We have been doing some fun topics about the alphabet, and watching the weather changing through the seasons, but yes, we also had a Teddy Bear's Picnic recently too!

Although Tiny Tots continues on, weekly during term time, without many of us in the church knowing much about what happens there, please pray for Tiny Tots and certainly pray for these special young families that God has brought here for us to serve.


